ACTIVITIES

Workshops and Symposia

- The **5th Workshop on the History and Philosophy of Programming (HaPoP5)** took place in Lille on June 13th 2022, organized by Liesbeth De Mol and Tomas Petricek. The Workshop was held in hybrid mode with about 40 participants
- Special Session on "Computing Language", organized by Liesbeth de Mol and Giuseppe Primiero (HaPoC Council) at the conference Computability in Europe 2022 (Swansea, 11-15 July, held in hybrid mode). The symposium was integrated by Troy Astarte, Maël Pégny, Jacopo Tagliabue and Juan Luis Gastaldi.
- Three-part Panel on "Computing Politics in late 20th and early 21st century," organized by Arianna Borrelli and Liesbeth De Mol (HaPoC Council) at the **Biannual Conference of the European Society for History of Science (ESHS22)** held in Brussels, 7-10 September 2022. HaPoC sponsored the event with three grants (Rudolf Seising (260 EUR), Daniel Trusilo (260 EUR), Jakob Tschandl (145 EUR). The panel had a highly interdisciplinary character, involving historians of science and of technology, general historians, and philosophers and led to lively discussions and exchanges. A proposal for publication of the proceedings is in preparation

Publications

• A significant amount of work has been dedicated to the publication of the **Post-Proceedings** of **HaPoC-6**, and a publication developed from the HaPoC Symposium at **DHST21** (Prague/virtual mode), to appear in 2023 (see "Publications" section under "Future Plans")

- Summer School *Logic for the AI Spring*, Lake Como School of Advanced Studies, Como, September 2022, organised by Tommaso Flaminio (Ramón y Cajal researcher, Artificial Intelligence Research Institute (IIIACSIC), Barcelona); Hykel Hosni (Full professor, Università degli studi di Milano); Giuseppe Primiero(Associate professor, Università degli studi di Milano and HaPoC Council). The event was supported with a HaPoC Grant to encourage the participation of early career scholars (250 EUR: Noemi Lubomirsky , Universidad Nacional de La Plata. Argentina; 250 EUR: Ane Marie Doh, University of St. Andrews, UK)
- "Imagining AI. Minds, manuscripts and machines," pop-up exhibition and event series, September 9-25 2022, Weston Library, Oxford, co-organized by Máté Szabo (HaPoC Council). HaPoC contributed to this event with a grant (250 EUR) for the transportation (from Hungary and back) of the "Szeged cybernetic ladybug," whose workings were demonstrated on the open day of the exhibit. The event brought in over 700 visitors.
